## **NATIONAL LIBRARY OF MEDICINE LISTS NATIONAL URBAN AIR TOXICS RESEARCH CENTER RESEARCH REPORTS**

Today, the Mickey Leland National Urban Air Toxics Research Center (NUATRC) announced that 13 of its research reports have been listed by the National Library of Medicine (NLM) and are available to researchers and the public through the NLM's online catalog, [www.LocatorPlus.gov](http://www.LocatorPlus.gov). "The Mickey Leland National Urban Air Toxics Research Center conducts rigorous, peer-reviewed research projects that further the scientific understanding of personal exposure and health effects of air toxics. The acceptance and listing of these studies in the Library of Medicine's catalog will provide researchers and the public with centralized access to this critical information", said Craig S. Beskid, President of the Center.

Since its inception in 1991, the NUATRC has conducted a research program designed to expand knowledge of the kinds of exposures to air toxics that individuals experience on a regular basis and the risks to public health that may be linked with these air toxics. Projects sponsored by the Center are designed to provide sound scientific data useful for researchers, as well as governmental officials charged with formulating environmental regulations. Recipients of NUATRC grant awards have included outstanding researchers at well-established research centers throughout the U.S.

The National Library of Medicine is a component of the National Institutes of Health. Its resources for historical scholarship in medicine and related sciences are among the richest in the world. Currently, NLM catalogs biomedical materials in more than 45 languages.
